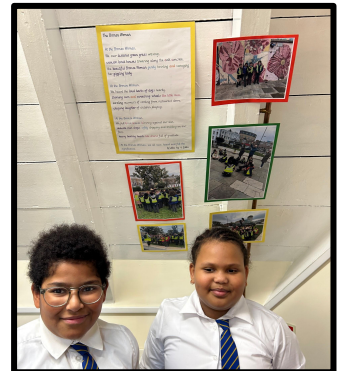

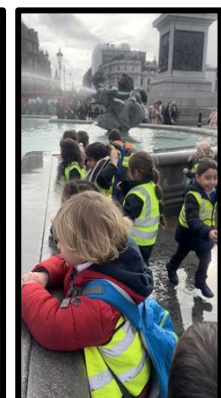
Black History Month Showcase
