Implementation

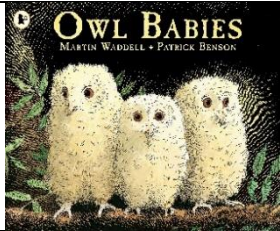
Each year group will have a 'Favourite Five' every half term. This will include a mixture of classics, traditional tales, non-fiction, culturally diverse and relevant books.

We have EVERY child leaving our school with a love of reading and a 'living-library' in their minds to take with them everywhere they go, to enable them to reach their full potential!

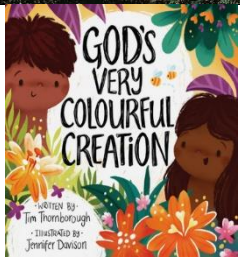
