

As part of the after-school club sessions at the Tresham Centre, Jamie has created an interactive game involving bean bags. After a successful first trial that was a lot of fun, he has shared the instructions on how to play the game with us.

Why not try out the game at home and let us know how you get on?

## Get the Bean Bag

You need:

- An open space
- 2 - 4 players
- 2 - 4 bean bags
- A referee



Instructions:

1. Put the bean bags at the other end of the space. (Jamie played in a hall but you could try indoors, if you have enough room, or in an open space outdoors).
2. Players line up to get ready.
3. On the word go, players race to get the bean bag then race back to the finish line.
4. First to cross the line wins.


# Meet Simon from our News Crew

## Games corner


How many weather words of three or more letters can you make?
