St. Peter's Extreme Reading Challenge





News about hymns and upcoming services

At present, although there are now no formal restrictions on hymn singing, we have been confining congregational hymn singing to one recessional hymn at both the 9.45 and the 11.15 Sunday services. Following what is being done by most London churches, and taking into account the views of many of the congregation, the Standing Committee has agreed that we should, from Sunday, reintroduce three congregational hymns at both main services; at the 9.45 a processional (introductory) hymn, an offertory hymn while the altar is prepared and a recessional hymn, at the end of the service. The motet and any communion hymns will continue to be sung by the cantor. At the 11.15 service we will have a processional, gradual and recessional hymn with an offertory motet by a cantor or choir. We are concerned that this change should not result in doubts about the level of safety for vulnerable people so we shall maintain the wearing of masks and remind people that social distancing should be observed, and that those with particular concerns are welcome to move to the emptier parts of the church.



It has been an incredibly fun week preparing for today's Enterprise Fair. The children have developed the core skills of communication, numeracy, literacy, problem-solving, using ICT and working with others. They have developed knowledge and understanding of the world of work. Enhanced their personal and social development and developed skills in citizenship.
