BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK 2025

Throughout the week, the year groups went on exciting visits to a local senior school, London Park, where we carried out fun investigations! From carrying out acid and base flame testing experiments, creating lava lamps, making craters in sand to building the perfect spaghetti bridge, we never had a dull moment and used lots of science skills to help us in our investigations.

Science is all about asking questions and we certainly asked many questions on Thursday morning as our classes travelled around the school in a carousel, visiting every classroom to view fascinating experiments shown to us by our teachers, who then explained to us the science behind each practical.
