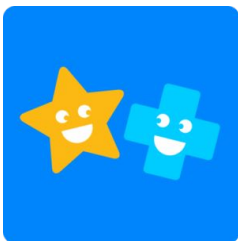

Greetings from St Peter's Church

From Fr Jonathan - Vicar of St Peter's Church

Dear parents and carers,

It was good to celebrate the life of St Matthew the Apostle at this week's School Mass and to pray especially for the children in St Matthew's House. St Matthew's Day properly falls on Sunday this year (21st September) when our services are at their usual times (8am, 9.30 am and 11 am). You are especially welcome at our 9.30 am Family Eucharist. This Sunday we say farewell to Mother Jacqui Miller who has been at St Peter's since 2019 and who is moving on to a new chapter and season of ministry. It would be lovely if you could join us to thank her for all that she has done and to bid her farewell.

Just a reminder that the Church will be opened as part of the Heritage Open Day on Friday 19 September from 1 pm to 5 pm and Saturday 20 September from 11 am to 5.30 pm. There will be a fascinating exhibition from Georgian when the church was first built in 1827 to modern day times and there will be activities for children and refreshments. Many thanks to all the children who submitted a picture of what the church might look like in 200 years time. Secondary School Supplementary Forms
