EYFS's RE

In RE, we have been exploring our big question, **“Why is Christmas so special to Christians?”** We have been learning about Mary and Joseph and thinking about how they might have prepared for the arrival of their baby. We listened to the story of the Angel Gabriel and how he delivered the surprising news to Mary, then reflected on how we might feel if an angel appeared to us with an important message. This week, we explored how Mary and Joseph may have felt when their plans suddenly changed, and talked about how we can sometimes feel disappointed too, but that trusting the journey can help us stay hopeful and brave. We will continue to learn more about the Nativity story to deepen our understanding of why Christmas holds such special meaning for Christians.
