5 RE Learning this week

This week in RE, Year 5 explored the question: "What happens in churches on Palm Sunday?" as part of our learning about Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

Pupils learnt that Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and remembers Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when crowds welcomed him by waving palm branches and shouting "Hosanna", meaning *save us*. We read and discussed the Biblical account from Matthew 21:1-11, considering how different groups of people responded to Jesus.

The class also learnt about how churches remember Palm Sunday today, including processions with palm branches, the distribution of palm crosses, the reading of the Passion narrative and the use of the liturgical colour red. Pupils explored the idea of ritual in Christianity and discussed how participating in these rituals might impact believers.

Children used key religious vocabulary such as Palm Sunday, Holy Week, procession and Hosanna, and reflected on how important events and traditions can shape people's beliefs and lives.
