Pupil Voice (EYFS KS1) RE Learning this week

Year 1

The big question for year 1 this half term is, 'Why is Easter the most important festival for Christians?'. We will be looking at Holy week and the lead up to Easter Sunday. This week we learned about Palm Sunday, and what it teaches us about Jesus. At the end of the lesson, we role-played Jesus entering Jerusalem on the donkey and the reaction of the crowd. We learned that most people were happy to see Jesus as they believed he was the new King. However, we also learned that some people didn't want Jesus to arrive as they were jealous of him or they didn't want him to change things. One of the most important lessons we are learning about Jesus is that, He is a **humble king**.

Year 2

This week in RE, we learned about the **symbol of the cross**, which is very important for Christians. We talked about how the cross reminds Christians of Jesus and how he showed love, kindness and forgiveness to others. The children reflected on what the cross represents and why it is a special symbol of faith and hope for Christians.

EYFS

This week in R.E., we have been exploring the question, "Why did Jesus go to a special garden?" We began by discussing what we like to do in a garden and then compared our ideas to why Jesus visited the Garden of Gethsemane. We talked about how Jesus was feeling worried and went to the garden to pray. We also shared our thoughts about praying and who we talk to when we feel worried. The children reflected on how Jesus took his three friends with him when he was feeling sad and worried, and how we can also talk to trusted people when we need support.
