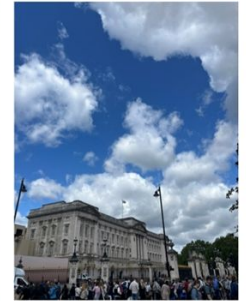
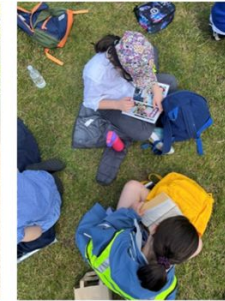


Year 4's Day Out at to Buckingham Palace!
