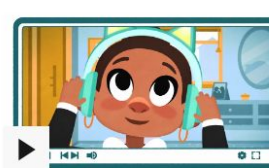
1. Money and how we pay for things: bartering to online banking

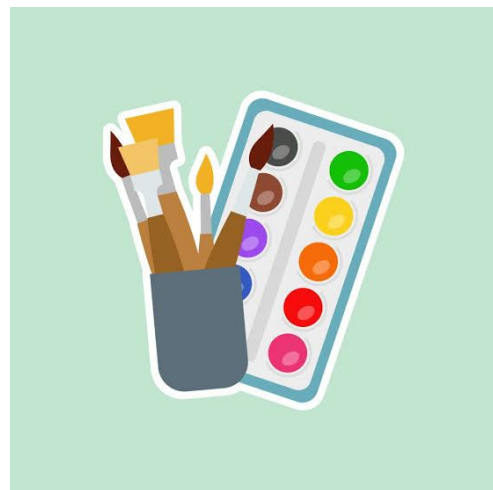
